# 72<sup>nd</sup> ANNUAL MEETING/BANQUET HIGHLIGHTS

The 72nd annual meeting/banquet was held on September 10, 2015, at the Goslin Nature Education Center on the grounds of Alley Park. The evening started off with a Board of Supervisors election. Dr. Jarrod Burks was the featured speaker. He specializes in geophysically detecting the unseen archaeological wonders that surround us, including ancient earthwork sites.

The 2014 Cooperator of the Year Awards were presented to the following: Joe and Cathy Young (Young Family Farms) and Mike and Margaret Thomas. Cooperators are selected annually based on their consistent work to improve their land by reducing soil loss due to erosion, installing conservation practices and participating in educational outreach to the community. Each cooperator received a sign to post on their farm.

The Conservation Partner Award honors partners that have demonstrated outstanding efforts in promoting conservation programs here in Fairfield County. Kelly Robberts with the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office was awarded the Conservation Partner of the Year Award for their cooperation in offering Fairfield County residents a safe way to dispose of unused and expired medication by cohosting drug collection events.

The Conservation Education Teacher of the Year Award is presented annually to a Fairfield County educator who has demonstrated outstanding commitment to teaching conservation, environmental awareness, and natural resource education to students in Fairfield County. The 2014 Conservation Education Teacher of the Year Award was given to Lee Wright, Coordinator of the Hosler Trust.

John Albert and Jim Krile were recognized for their terms served on the Board of Supervisors. Matt Reese and Don Rector were both elected to three-year terms on the Board of Supervisors beginning January 1, 2016.



# NEW SERVICE FORESTER FOR FAIRFIELD COUNTY

Do you have a woods or want to establish one? Fairfield County has a new ODNR Service Forester available to assist you. Jason Van Houten has been an ODNR forester for 5 years, helping landowners prepare for and minimize negative impacts from the emerald ash borer, maintaining small woodlots and woodland benefits in urbanizing areas, and helping out other ODNR service foresters.

ODNR service forestry assistance is available in every Ohio county regarding forest management, watershed protection, insect and disease control, forest recreation, tree planting, and wildlife habitat development. ODNR service foresters also assist Ohio landowners with Ohio Forest Tax Law and cost-share incentive programs. Ohio landowners considering a timber harvest can utilize ODNR service foresters to decide if a harvest is appropriate, how a harvest can support their objectives, trees to harvest and protect, how to protect soil and water, and how to maximize money received from the sale of timber.

# FARMS PROTECTED WITH CLEAN OHIO FUNDS

The Board of Fairfield County Commissioners in partnership with the Ohio Department of Agriculture have closed two more agricultural easements.

Fairfield County's 15th easement was with the Nickerson-Howard families on 220 acres in Richland Township.

This brings the total of protected land in Richland Township alone to 1,101.46 acres with 1/3 of that being floodplain/floodway and areas below dams which means farmland preservation helps mitigate the risk for future loss of life or property damaged along the Little Rush Creek.

#### NEW DEER DAMAGE PROCEDURE

The way you get deer crop damage permits has changed. The new procedure is as follows:

- 1. File a complaint at www.wildohio.gov. If you do not have computer access, contact Tommy Springer, Fairfield SWCD Wildlife Specialist, and he will make arrangements to get the permit through the SWCD office.
- 2. An e-mail will be sent to the SWCD office stating you have deer damage. A field investigation will be done.
- 3. If damage is occurring, Tommy will fill out and file the permit.
- 4. You will receive an e-mail telling you that you have a deer damage permit and the number of tags issued. (You will no longer have paper tags.)
- 5. You will still have to provide a copy of the permit to each shooter. It is the responsibility of your shooters to make sure tags are still available before shooting. Before shooting they need to check online and make sure there are tags left.
- 6. Once they harvest a deer they have five days to check in the deer. The most effective way is to tag deer in on-line.

The SWCD will again offer two college scholarships of \$500 for any graduating senior that plans to study Agriculture, Natural

Resources Conservation, Environmental Education, Geology and Biology. The applicant must have a minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.

Applications for this scholarship can be acquired from high school guidance counselors, the SWCD office or through the Fairfield SWCD website at www.fairfieldswcd.org under the Education tab. Along with the application, an official high school transcript, 400 word essay and two letters of recommendation are required.

Scholarship money will be awarded after the applicant successfully completes the first semester of college and has maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale. The deadline to apply is March 31. Please contact the SWCD office at (740) 653-8154 with questions.


Tommy Springer, our Conservation Tech./Wildlife Specialist, has taken on the education duties of the SWCD and is now our Education/Wildlife Specialist.


